All first time in college (Fall 2014 and beyond) students are required to successfully complete two years of the same foreign language in high school or two semesters of the same foreign language at the college level before the associate degree is awarded.

Plan to take BCH 4024 Introduction to Biochemistry and Molecular Biology and MCB 3020 Basic Biology of Microorganisms in the summer at UF before admission into the Pharmacy program. Contact COP Pharm.D. admissions advisor at least two semesters prior to the semester students need to take these courses to insure to insure they are registered in time to attend them.
